Why don't you join our fantastic team of volunteers at Llantrisant Guildhall and help bring this heritage and visitors' centre to life!

Llantrisant Guildhall is a Grade II Listed Building which has undergone a massive £1.4million restoration project and now tells the remarkable story of one of Wales's oldest towns.

As the centre of power in the ancient borough for more than 650 years, the 14th century building has been transformed into an elegant exhibition and education facility.

The registered charity that runs the building relies on volunteers to continue the success story of Llantrisant Guildhall as a premiere attraction in this part of South Wales.

It is home to a plethora of unique treasures, including the solid silver Mace of 1633 which survived the Civil War and is older than the one in the House of Commons.

A full-scale exhibition of the life of cremation pioneer Dr William Price sits alongside the life-size mannequin of a Llantrisant archer who fought at the Battle of Crecy in 1346.

A wide range of interactive displays are available alongside many unique artefacts including the 18th century longcase clock made in Llantrisant and found in Swindon and a portrait of the Llantrisant-born Lord Mayor of London Sir David Evans which has been in storage in Cardiff Mansion House for decades.

As well as telling the story of Llantrisant, the refurbished landmark hosts a wide variety of community events, including exhibitions, conferences, weddings, activities, guest speaking programmes, concerts, private parties and school visits.

The building is available for hire and the adjacent Castle Green hosts community-based activities, open air concerts and cinema along with a variety of celebratory events.
