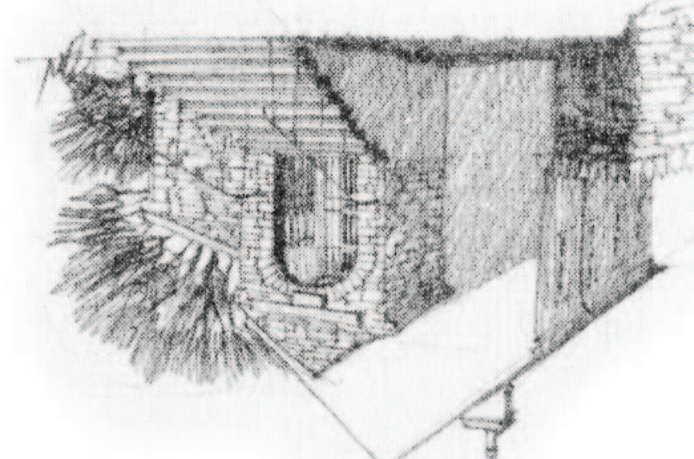

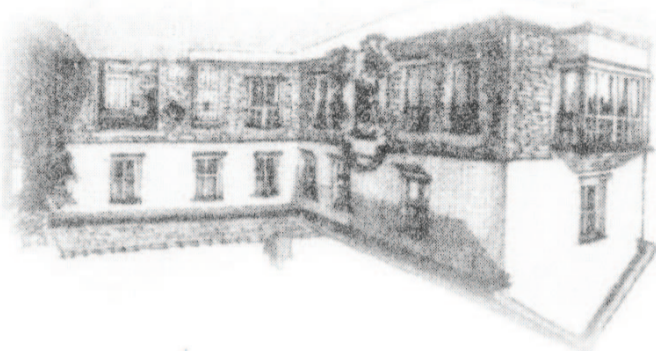

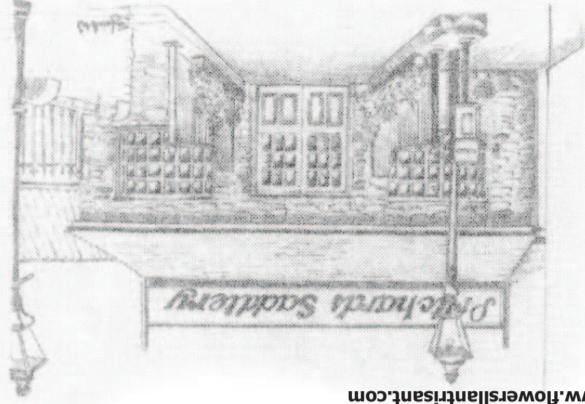
Art & Home

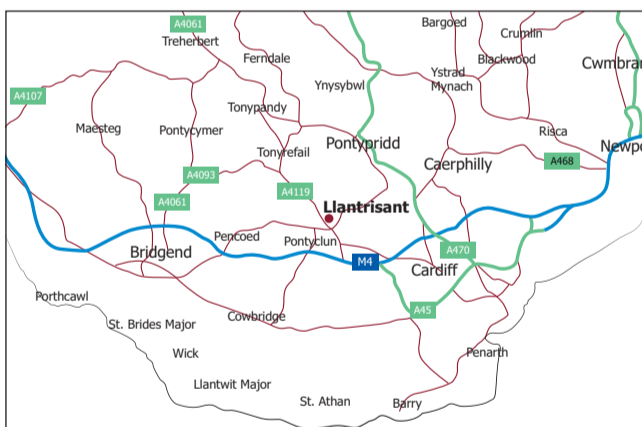
THE NEW INN

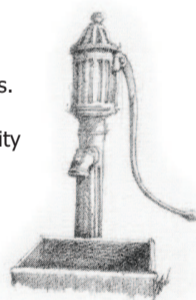


THE WHEATSHEAF

BILLY WYNT

At the highest point of the town stands the remains of a 13th-century lookout post for the castle or maybe a windmill as often believed. It is a tower known locally as the "Billy Wynt". By the early 19th century the tower was in ruins and in 1893 it was restored as a folly. Reach the summit from Heol-y-Graig.



THE PARISH CHURCH

Llantrisant Parish Church stands on the skyline of Llantrisant and represents a celebration of faith for more than a thousand years. There is evidence that the church dates back to the 12th century, but within the church is an inscribed cross dating to the 7th century. One of its significant features is the East Window, which was the work of the late 19th-century artist Edward Burne Jones and depicts a beardless Christ.

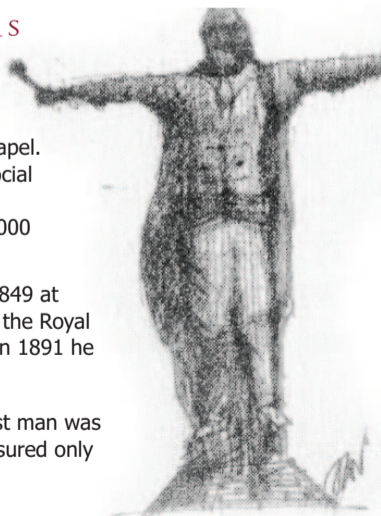


FAMOUS CHARACTERS

One of Llantrisant's most famous residents was Dr. William Price, the pioneer of cremation, who lived near the site of the former Zoar Chapel. An iconic statue to the druid and social reformer stands proudly on the Bull Ring facing East Caerlan where 20,000 attended his cremation in 1893.

Sir David Evans, who was born in 1849 at Glanmychudd Farm near the site of the Royal Mint, was a Freeman of the town. In 1891 he was made Lord Mayor of London.

Hopkin Hopkins, the world's shortest man was born in the parish in 1736. He measured only 2ft 7in tall, 0.787m.



THE BULL RING

Llantrisant was an important market town from the 13th century. Whilst the fairs and markets took place next to the Guildhall, the Bull Ring was used for the bull baiting. This practice was disallowed here in 1827, not because of the cruelty factor, but because it was encouraging unruly crowds. It is believed that the original bull baiting stone is buried in Llantrisant Common. In 1982, a statue of Doctor William Price was erected on the Bull Ring.

LLANTRISANT CASTLE

Llantrisant Castle was, at its time of construction in 1246, an important fortification. Its position overlooking the Vale of Glamorgan and the northern uplands was a significant feature. It was held by the de Clare family and in 1326 was an overnight prison for Edward II. By the early 16th century the castle was in ruins and now all that remains is part of the Raven Tower.
